"The Transatlantic Passages of Francisco Gomes: Slavery, Freedom, and the Social Origins of the Brazilian Community in Lagos."

Prof. Kristin Mann is an outstanding specialist on the social history of eighteenth through twentieth-century West Africa, notably on gender, marriage, and the family; slavery, emancipa-tion, and the slave trade; colonial political and legal changes; and commercial and agricultural transformations. She is currently in Bayreuth as a BIGSAS Associate Senior Fellow.
